<u>Electronic Prescribing of Medications</u> Certification Criteria: §170.314(a)(1) Computerized Order Entry of Medications	Electronic Prescribing allows licensed providers, that have prescribing privileges, to send prescriptions electronically to pharmacies. Medical Mime Inc uses DrFirst Rcopia for transmission of electronic prescriptions and ID proofing	Medical Mime provides electronic prescribing via our third party vendor/partner DrFirst. Per that agreement there is a 1time set-up fee and an annual maintenance fee per provider for use of the service. Drug Formulary is included in this service.	One-time ID verification is required by the prescribing provider. This is a requirement of DrFirst to confirm the identity of the provider	Requires internet connection. This includes, but is not necessarily limited to, laboratory results Medical Mime Inc has the ability to connect with any vendor that follows the HL7 standards specified in certification.	Medical Mime does not charge for Laboratory interface. However, some Laboratories may charge a fee for interfacing or maintaining the connection for results.	Each practice/organization will need a contract with the laboratory or other facility that provides the results.	Requires internet connection. Users will have the ability to set up an interface (connection) with a radiology facility thereby allowing the import of their radiology results as a text based report (this does not include images). Medical Mime Inc has the ability to connect with any vendor that follows the HL7 standards specified in certification.	Medical Mime does not charge for Radiology interface. However, some Radiology centers may charge a fee for interfacing or maintaining the connection for results.	Each practice/organization will need a contract with the Imaging Center or other facility that provides the results.	Requires internet connection. Users will have the ability to generate patient specific documents in a standard format (CCDA files) in batches.
